'SEE WHERE THE ADVENTURE TAKES YOU!

New adventures await! This is the time of year that children go to school for the first time, middle school kids move up to high school, and youth go to college. Adults are sending their children off to new challenges, getting back into a more normal pace of life, and looking forward to Saints football! This change of season also offers new opportunities to use your influence for Christ. Consider what this profound passage means for you this fall:

"For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." (Ephesians 2:10)

This passage reveals three amazing things about ourselves and God:

- 1. First, 'you are God's handiwork'! You were beautifully made by God with incredible loving care. God took delight in forming you. He did not go about this haphazardly, but with great intentionality. He has given you a unique personality, passions, talents, and gifts. You are made in God's image so that you will reflect God's divine nature. Therefore, you can join the Psalmist declaring, 'You created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made" (Psalm 139:13-14)
- 2.Second, Christ Jesus has recreated you for good works. Before Jesus came into our lives we were like little lost puppies. Jesus has brought us into His family for a purpose. Paul puts it this way: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ ...And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us." (II Cor 5:19-20) You and I are heralds of the new creation, ambassadors proclaiming the power of Jesus to make all things new. God has put all kinds of people in your path for you and you alone to demonstrate and invite them into life in Christ.
- 3. Finally, God has prepared in advance for these good works. God brings people into your life for a reason. There is no 'coincidence' but only 'God-instances'. Everything changes when you grasp that. Everything you do and say matters since it can bring God's blessings into others' lives. Like Adam and Eve, we have been given our part of the garden to bring order and fruitfulness. God has placed us right where He wants us to work, and play, and raise families. We have been positioned to do the good works that reflect the goodness of God. Finishing up a summer of work at a Christian family conference center, one of my friends said, 'Well, it's back to the real world now." I thought for a moment about what he said and responded, "No, we have been prepared to go back into the 'real world'."

As we enter this new season of the year, consider that God has made us for such a time as this. Jesus has recreated us to herald His kingdom. God has prepared the way for every good word and deed. Now it is up to us to live it out. We are in for a grand adventure this fall. Jump in with both feet and see where it takes us!

RENEW ME, IF YOU DON'T MIND...

Renewing the mind is a Biblical concept that involves allowing God to bring to the surface the lies we have accepted and replace them with truth of His Word. The Wednesday Men's group just finished reading The Shack by William P. Young. In this story, the protagonist Makenzie (Mack)Agu comes face to face with the fears and lies that have overshadowed his relationships throughout his life. It reminds me of what one of my friends once sagely declared: "It's not the lies we tell others that do the most damage... the worst lies are the ones we tell ourselves."

What has this to do with renewing our minds? Pretty much everything. The degree to which we are frankly and brutally honest with ourselves about our own sinfulness is the degree to which we are open to be transformed by the Truth of Christ. Proverbs declares "For as he thinks in his heart, so is he." In James Allen's seminal work As A Man Thinketh he writes "In the armory of thought [man] forges the weapons by which he destroys himself. He also fashions the tools with which he builds for himself heavenly mansions of joy and strength and peace." Could it be that we have so much power at the ready, yet so little will to yield it?

Paul states plainly in Romans that we should not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewing of our minds. This means that we should not allow the world to shape our thinking but instead allow God's Word to transform us from the inside out. Renewing the mind is an important precept in Wesleyan Methodism. John Wesley advocated deliberateness in devotion. We are to be intentional disciples, spending time in God's Word, reading, studying, and meditating daily so as to apply it as though our very lives depend upon it! The same goes for prayer and worship.

We've all heard the old trope "He didn't fail for want of trying..." But GK Chesterton was much nearer to the truth when he lamented "The Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting; it has been found difficult and left untried."

Christianity is not soft soap, as C.S. Lewis might have put it. It's hard, and demanding, and not for the faint of heart. It requires all that is in us, which is more than we think we can give. Most importantly, it requires a willingness to be renewed in our minds. Only then can we face the day with the hope of forever.

RENEWING OUR MIND IN THE PSALMS

I have talked about Psalm 1 in a previous Messenger article, but it is time for us to revisit this deep well of spiritual wisdom and practice as we discuss the renewal of our minds in Christ Jesus. We live in a day and age--and have always lived in a day and age--where the wrong values, the wrong philosophies, and the wrong practices have been elevated to a status of "the good life". These ways of life are seen as effective. efficient. hardworking. dedicated. honorable, and even admired. These ways being, hustle, hurry, packed schedules, long work weeks, the "always being on call" mentality, watching out for one's self, the "do whatever needs to be done to achieve the goal" mentality.

This is not the blessed way. Psalm 1 opens with a Hebrew word, Ashrey, which can translate to blessed, happy, good, or content. So, what does this blessed life, this good life, look like? It looks like walking with God, meditating on His word,

taking time to be with Him, not rushing, hurrying and hustling, but stopping our busy lives and entering into life with God. This is the good and blessed way, this is why we must renew our minds. Society tells us one thing, which leads to death and desolation as the Psalmist here points out in the latter half of Psalm 1. The blessed life is counter cultural, it is slow and meaningful, not self-seeking but Godseeking; it is transformative.

I encourage you to stop before, during, and after your workday, taking ten minutes each time and spend it with a Psalm, like Psalm 1 or 100, 23, or 145. Just meditate on the psalm; read it over and over, sitting in silence for a moment and listening to God. Renew your mind in His word and be transformed into life with our great God.


