#### 'Witnessing God's Joy'

We have entered Advent with Christmas fast approaching. It is amazing that in this season of joy and peace we can often feel anxious. We become



anxious about decorating and making our homes beautiful. We become anxious about getting all our work done so we can enjoy the holiday. Parties wear us out, yet we hope that our parties are a success. We worry about the big Christmas gathering, are nervous about the difficult family members and the religious and political conversations that never end well. Basically, we are afraid that nothing will turn out as we hoped.

Perhaps we aren't that different from those we read about in the Christmas story. The prophets Isaiah and Jeremiah foretold the Messiah's coming. Not only the religious leaders but all the Israelites were full of anxiety as they awaited their salvation. Exactly when and where would the Messiah be born? Nothing seemed to be going right. They were full of fear under the brutal occupation of Rome. They had family squabbles about faith and politics. The mandatory festivals reminded them of God's salvation which heighted their own yearning for freedom? Mary, Joseph, Zechariah, Elizabeth, and everyone else were full of anxiety when something unimaginably good happened.

God paved the way for His son with wonderful announcements. Each one began with 'Fear Not!' Zechariah was lighting incense in the Temple when an angel appeared to him. Zechariah was stunned, amazed and fearful. That fear was quickly dispelled. "Do not be afraid, Zechariah! Your prayer has been heard." (Luke 1:13) Zechariah would receive the joy of a son. Mary was more than startled by the angel Gabriel who told her, "Do not be afraid, Mary! You have found favor with God." (Lk 1:30) She experienced unimaginable joy as she embodied life in God. Later, an angel appeared to Joseph in a dream with the words, "Do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 1:20) Joseph would experience the joy of playing a part in God's larger plan.

The story that brings us to a joyful conclusion is that of the shepherds. Though fearful at first, the angels told them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people." (Luke 2:10)

Don't be filled with anxiety and fear this Christmas, rather, be a witness to God's unfolding joy in the world.

Friends, we must be "Christmas people" all year round, not just in December. We are called to enter into one another's suffering in a way that mirrors Christ's sacrifice for us. No one ever walked away from the church because too many people were willing to take the time to really listen and share their burdens. But countless have been lost because the opposite is all too often true.

This year, as we celebrate Christmas, let us face the fact that we are to live out our faith in Jesus in a way that requires more of us than we are comfortable giving. But take heart, for God does not require more than He has equipped us for.

## 'THE MESSENGER COMES WITH FIRE'


"I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come," says the Lord Almighty. But who can stand when he appears? For he will be like a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap. He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver; he will purify the Levites and refine them like gold and silver. Then the Lord will have men who will bring offerings in righteousness." Malachi 3:1-3

Malachi whose name means "My Messenger", was a minor prophet who wrote the last book of the Old Testament. The main emphasis of his book is that God has promised to send a Messenger to us. God knew it would be a long time (400 years) before the birth of His Son and desired to encourage His people not to give up hope that what God has promised, He will fulfill. While it was comforting to Israel to know God has not forgotten them, the verbiage used to describe this Messenger was hardly the cozy glow of Christmas lights and joyful music, but more of a roaring blaze. "The messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come. **But who can endure the day of his coming? Who can stand when he appears?"**

Matt and Josh Leroy state in their book, Protagonist, "God is a refiner's fire who draws close, bent on purifying and transforming us into priceless gold. The brilliance and blaze of this refiner's fire does not destroy us. It transforms us. When we think of this season, we often reflect on what Jesus brings. But Malachi reminds us he has also come to take away. To give his life and take away our sin. To burn away all that is not gold and cannot survive the refinement process."

Let us enjoy the baby in the manger and all the wonder surrounding His birth, but do not forget Jesus has come to change the world, which includes you. What Love! That hope alone brings us joy! Merry Christmas!

## **'HOPE IN THE PROMISE'**

Words of a promise – a promise most remembered from another season and another place – not at Christmas near Bethlehem but at Easter in Galilee.

"I am with you always," the resurrected Jesus promises the remaining eleven disciples at the end of Matthew's gospel. (Matt 28:20)

This same promise resounds as the promise of Advent, for the story of Christmas rests on it. God promises the people of Israel through the words of prophets and psalmists that He is with them, though they betray God and sin and follow other gods many times...God still promises them "I am with you."

God promises Mary through the angel Grabriel, "I am with you and find favor with you, blessed art thou among women" (Luke 1:28) Mary replies, "Here I am Lord, let it be to me according to your word. (Luke 1:38)

In a dream, an angel appears to Joseph, Mary's husband-to-be, and tells him to not be afraid to take Mary as his wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give Him the name of Jesus. God promises Joseph, "I am with you." He has the promise that God – Immanuel, is already with him. (Matt 1:20-23) When Joseph awoke, he took Mary as his wife, in doing so he promises her, "I am with you." (Matt 1:24)

Promise by promise the Advent story is told. God promises, through the words of prophets; in the songs of psalmists; from the lips of angels; by a fresh tiny cry in the night.

A promise made by God, to a young virgin, by the trust of a man, through the hope of a people, in the flesh of humanity.

From the beginning to the end, Jesus Christ embodies God's promise to be the world, for you and for me: "I am with you."

Behold, the promise of Hope is given!

#### THINK ABOUT IT

From 1558 to 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly during the 12 days of Christmas (from Christmas Day to Epiphany). During this period "The Twelve Days of Christmas" was written as a catechism song for young children. The hidden meanings of the song's gifts were intended to help the children remember the lessons of their faith and were known only to members of the church. Instead of referring to an early suitor, the "true love" refers to God Himself. The "me" is symbolic of every believer in Christ. The "partridge" is our Savior, Jesus Christ. In the song, Christ is a symbol of mother partridge, who protects her helpless nestlings from predators.

The meanings of the other symbols are:

2 turtle doves: Old and New Testaments

3 French hens: Faith, Hope, and Love

4 calling birds: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John

5 gold rings: Torah (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy)

6 geese-a-laying: 6 days of creation (Genesis 1)

7 swans-a-swimming: 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit (I Cor 12)

8 maids-a-milking: the Beatitudes (Matt 5)

9 ladies dancing: the 9 fruit of the Holy Spirit (Gal 5:22)

10 lords-a-leaping: 10 Commandments (Ex 20)

11 pipers piping: 11 faithful disciples

12 drummers drumming: 12 points of belief in the Apostles Creed

When you hear this catchy tune during the holidays this year, think about the true meaning behind the secret symbols. Look up the passages and "think about it". It's interesting and creative; written to inspire us through the ages. Only now, we can sing our hearts out in total freedom. Now we know how that strange song became a Christmas Carol that children and adults still sing five centuries later.
