

Below is an interview with Jan that will bring many memories to mind for you and reveal her heart for all she has done at and for Munholland.

How long have you been the Choir Director at Munholland?

I took the position right after Hurricane Katrina, in 2005, so I'm in my 18th year.

What are a few of your best memories?

- Working with the section leaders/soloists. They not only supported the Chancel Choir, but helped me with responsibilities and became close friends along the way.
- Watching our children, Ben and Jason, flourish and grow in the nursery with Ms. Tami, in Sunday School, and in Youth Group.
- Singing in our trio, The Grace Notes, with Julianne Korn and Brindley McWhorter.
- Being the puppeteer for all the summer VBS adventures.
- Successfully figuring out how to do choral music during the pandemic.
- Being a member of Christians Under Construction small group and making lifelong friends there.
- Working with Phil Sparks, the absolute BEST organist/pianist I could've ever wished for.
- Being coerced to sit in the dunking booth at one of our outdoor festivals, when all my children's choir kids' parents had to pay a fortune for them to try and dunk me!
- Having my mother sing in my choir. That was priceless.

What are some of the funniest things that happened during those years?

Most of the funniest moments happened while teaching children. Once I was teaching the kids in KDO a song with the words, "Jesus is born." All of a sudden, I realized that one of the kids was loudly singing "Jesus is BORING!"

Another time we were singing "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands." I always let each child come up with two things to put in the song where it says, "He's got the wind and the rain in His hands." So, one Sunday morning we wound up singing, "He's got the steak and the shrimp in His hands." I guess that child had had a delicious dinner the night before! Other than that, Ford Dieth always kept us laughing during choir practice with his wry sense of humor.

You have been here long enough to see a generation come through. What has it been like to see children go all the way through your training?

Well, there is a group of children who are graduating this year who started singing with me in the pre-school Sunday School room. As they grew, they participated in the Littlest Angels and the Altar Choir. I loved staging the Nativity program each year. Each spring we had a celebration of children's music when each choir would perform and the children who took piano lessons were asked to play a song or two. Some of those children sang in a

"I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will advise you with My eye upon you." Psalm 32: 8 It is utterly amazing to see what God will do through someone whose life is completely devoted to Him! I know no better example of this than Esther Ndichafah, the founder and president of Hope International Foundation (HIF), in Cameroon, West Africa. Hope International is just one of the missions we support here at Munholland, and I wanted you to share in praising God for what He continues to do through these faithful servants who have so little.

Below is a summary of Esther's 13-page 2022 Activities Report:

- 1. Through medical personnel, chaplaincy services and ministry volunteers, patients were served at 2 hospitals with medical care, preaching, prayer, counseling, gifts, food, clothes and, at times, financial aid for medical bills.
- 2. Staff Support with daily devotions, special fellowship programs on Labor Day and other holidays, financial support and gifts when needed.
- 3. Monthly Discipleship Outreach Programs to 3 neighboring villages, with education on practical subjects, prayer, counseling, healthcare supplies, and meeting physical needs.
- 4. Provide food to over 300 prisoners every month, with emergency medical care given.
- 5. Distributed medical supplies and vitamins to 45 health clinics in outlying areas. One visit was to an area with a deadly cholera outbreak.
- 6. Carried out several health campaigns in the Bonendale community, benefiting more than 1,000 community members
- 7. Two successful water projects, benefiting more than 2000 people who were deprived of potable water for home use.
- 8. Assisted 200 internally displaced children with food, healthcare products, quality nutrition items and clothing, with special attention to the sickle cell and malnourished.
- 9. Paid for 203 children's school fees; 3 of those are university students!
- 10. Psychosocial counselling services were provided to over 400 people.
- 11. Five people were given financial micro-supplements for small business aid.
- 12. The biggest achievement of 2022 was the construction of a 2-block primary school in Chad, with 6 classrooms, 4 offices, a 6 room toilet block and all the furniture needed. These children formerly attended school under huts which were constructed annually.






HOLY LAND TRIP





And so, He called it......Dad

This lovely poem, an ode to our earthly fathers, describes the beautiful attributes of a dad who is in step with our heavenly father's character. And the Bible has spoken volumes about how God's design for fatherhood is to be fulfilled. In the Old Testament, family patriarchs led their families spiritually, serving as a "shepherd to his flock". He was to lead his family to God and into a life of study, prayer and faithfulness. Exodus 20:12: "Honor your father and mother, so that you may live long in the land the Lord God is giving you." Sometimes children need to be taught how to honor their parents. This is the only commandment that has a promise added to it, so it is important to teach them the why behind the what. In Joshua 24, we see Joshua bringing the Israelites out of bondage, headed to the Promise(d) Land. In verses 14-15 Joshua declares, "Now fear the Lord and serve Him with all faithfulness. Throw away the gods your ancestors worshipped.......choose for yourselves which gods you will serve. But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord".
