

'Living in Gratitude'

The Psalmist captures the spirit of Thanksgiving in this simple verse: 'The eyes of all look to you, and



you give them their food at the proper time. You open your hand & satisfy the desires of every living thing.'(Ps.145:15-16) This is a beautiful vision of all living creatures looking to God for sustenance. I picture baby birds in a nest chirping and opening their mouths when the mother bird comes with food. They know that she will feed them. They trust her vigilant care. Too much of the time when times are tough and relationships are hard, we look inward for solutions, rather than upward to God's wisdom and care. Here are three ways that you can increase trust and gratitude in God's daily provision.

First, remember how precious you are to God. Jesus said: 'Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?' (Mt 6:25-33) As you look at the beauty of creation, remember that you are more beautiful still to God. You are so dear to God that He sent His only Son for you! God loves to care for you.

Second, focus on what you have. Epictetus wrote, 'He is a wise man who does not grieve for the things which he has not, but rejoices for those which he has.' Envying others can cause us to forget all the good that we have, both tangible and intangible. I remember going through a tight financial time and grumbling to God. God didn't let me go down that losing path. God challenged me by bringing to my mind all the blessings I had received in the previous months. My attitude immediately changed from grumbling to gratitude!

Third, change the atmosphere in your home or office by saying 'Thank You'. Thankfulness has a snowball effect. Gratitude increases the sense of well-being in the person who you thank, which in turn makes them more grateful to those around them. I challenge you to say 'Thank You' every day to each family member and each person with whom you work. Express appreciation for what they do, as well as for who they are. You will be amazed how thankfulness grows around you and within you.

I visited a mentor of mine, Dave Enochs, several weeks before he succumbed to cancer. We talked about his life - family, work, friends, Scouting - and he was filled with joy. He radiated gratitude and contentment despite his lack of energy. With a twinkle in his eye, he said to me, 'Life is good, and getting better all the time!' Dave lived in trust and gratitude, and we can do the same.

'SERVING THE PERSECUTED CHURCH'

You met a man during the Ministry Minute on Sunday October 22. For security we will call him Samuel (not his real name). He is a man who has God's hand on his life and ministry. Jesus came to Samual in person when he was 12 and spoke to him about the plan for his life. He told him that "you, Samuel, will take my name to the nations". He has been obeying God in this plan for many many years and now works in "closed countries" to Christianity.

As God leads him, Samuel seeks out other Christians in those closed countries and teaches and disciples leaders who can then seek out those who are open to hearing the gospel of Jesus Christ. Samuel is in danger of his life being 'taken from him if he is found out and he is concerned about the safety and lives of those he teaches and disciples if they are found out to be Jesus followers.

Samuel works with the indigenous people to build an underground home church. Being underground means they meet in secret. There are two underground churches planted at this time and they are ready to start more when the time is right. These home churches are led by those who have been discipled and can now teach and disciple the new believers.

One such new believer is leaving her country and coming to stay at Samuel's house with his family. It is for her safety. She has been threatened by her family; they were not satisfied when the national courts shortened her prison sentence when she changed her religion. Her family wanted her to serve more time and her very life is threatened by them. With Samuel she can be taken care of and taught about Jesus and His love for her and can be discipled in the way we are to live as Christians according to the Bible.

Please pray for this family, their ministry and the people who are risking their lives for the gospel of Christ. Please pray for this girl and others who are escaping prison and even death because they became a Christ follower.

"The Gospel is only good news if we get to someone before they die." JD Greear. There are 4.5 billion people today who do not profess to be Christians, and half of those have never heard the good news and have no access to the Gospel, because no one is around to tell them.

"My little children, these things I write to you, so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. And He Himself is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the whole world."

1 John 2:1-2 NKJV

Propitiation. What does that mean? This word is used four times in scripture, one of which is here in this passage from 1 John. This word describes Christ, through His sacrificial death, as appearing the wrath of God on the account of sin

Through Christ's atoning death, we find great mercy to the sinner who believes in Him. It is through this death that we are reconciled to God. We can have a relationship with God, we can be counted-- just as the prophets and Abrahm-- as a friend of God! This is not because of any work or good thing we have done or can do it is only through the work of our God in Christ Jesus on the cross that all our sins are washed away. All the shame we have for what we have done, all the guilt we feel, is washed away in the blood Jesus shed for us on the cross. This great forgiveness and life is for those who have given their lives to Jesus Christ; who not only acknowledge Christ as God and as savior, but put full trust in Him that He has saved us on the cross. Jesus Christ is saving us from our sin right now, and He will save us when He returns and judges the world. This is the great hope we have as believers; that our God is redeeming us right here and right now, and that He is preparing a place for us, to be with Him.

Therefore, we are thankful. Therefore, we give Him our lives in service and gratitude, and show love, grace and mercy to all people, being the hands and feet of Jesus Christ. We live in thanksgiving always, not just once a year, but always for the work that Christ has done for us. If you do not know Jesus as God and as your savior, I invite you to pray and invite Jesus into your heart, acknowledge Him as Lord and savior, place all your hope in Him that He will save us. Get to know Jesus by reading the gospel of Mark. There you will find true thankfulness that overflows in your life, which you can share with other people.



THINK ABOUT IT

When God calls us into His plan, it is not our talent or intelligence He is interested in. He looks specifically for those who will do His will, regardless of their personal ability or personal agenda. Paul is a great example of this kind of person. He was respected among religious leaders in Israel. As an intelligent Pharisee, he would seem to be the likely choice to present the Gospel of Jesus to the influential Jews. But instead, God sent Paul to the Gentiles where his religious background would be of little importance. Paul would now have to rely on the Holy Spirit to fulfill God's plan.

Whatever we are commissioned to do in the Kingdom, we will need the grace that comes from time spent in God's presence in order to fulfill our assignment. Many Christians are disappointed in their spiritual walk because they have "worked hard" and merely directed their prayers toward situations in their lives in a desire to bring about needed change. But they have failed to see any real results. Often they try to use their faith to change external circumstances when they may lack the level of inner strength to sustain the faith they are exercising. They first need to grow in grace.

Grace is the inner substance that will sustain us as we apply the principles of faith to change things. If we give up on the inside, we will surely faint on the outside. i.e. faith overcomes the problems but Grace keeps the problems from overcoming us! Grace comes through the power of the Holy Spirit, which becomes the power of God to do for us what we can't do on our own. All of us will ultimately find ourselves in Paul's shoes ~ we too, will need to rely on the power of the spirit to complete God's assignments for us. Then, and only then will God get all the Glory.
