

Dear Church Family,

On May 25, 2023, the Church Council appointed a Transitional Task Force. which became the Affiliation Task Force, to research potential denominational affiliation options. The Task Force met several times, led two congregational informational meetings, developed a website of resources and information, received input from the congregation through a survey, and heard from the congregation through multiple question and answer sessions. The Task Force Survey revealed that the top considerations for the congregation are Doctrine & Theology, Ownership of Property, Pastoral Standards and Appointments, and Denominational Accountability.

After a thorough 3-month time of research into over a dozen Methodist denominations, and with much prayer, the Affiliation Task Force recommended to the Church Council on September 8, 2023, that Munholland Methodist Church join the Global Methodist Church (GMC). The GMC is the Methodist connectional system that most aligns with Munholland's Methodist identity. Subsequently, the Church Council discussed the Task Force recommendation and voted in favor of the recommendation to join the GMC. The Church Council invited a representative of the GMC to speak to Munholland about the denomination and answer questions on September 20, 2023. The Church Council now puts the decision before the Professing Members of Munholland to vote on whether or not Munholland will become a member of the Global Methodist Church.

Affiliation vs. Independence is an important decision in the life of our church. We each should go to the Munholland website and go over the material available for review concerning affiliation, independence, and the Church Council's recommendation to join the GMC.

There are members of Munholland who believe this process is moving too quickly. There are pros and cons to the timing that is in place. The most prevalent con seems to be that the Global Methodist Church has not had its first General Conference and that Munholland should wait and see the results of that denominational meeting. That meeting will occur in the fall of 2024.

There are primarily two pros to the current timing of having the Church vote on October 15. First, we can have the decision made before the Holy time of the Advent Season. Second, the sooner

As men, we face many challenges and temptations every day. One of my favorite songs is "Bridge Over Troubled Water" by Simon and Garfunkel. I invite you to consider the lyrics, and imagine Jesus Himself singing these words to you...

When you're weary, feeling small
When tears are in your eyes, I'll dry them all
I'm on your side .. Oh, when times get rough
And friends just can't be found
Like a bridge over troubled water, I will lay me down
Like a bridge over troubled water, I will lay me down

When facing troubled waters, do we remember who He is, or lose sight of what He has done, and is calling us to do? Already He has laid himself down for us. Now is the time to rekindle our love for Him, not when the water is up to our necks. Commitment to Christ is not a one-time decision, but a dynamic lifelong journey. Nor is it a matter of convenience, but of conviction.

Scripture tells us that God is faithful, even when we are not (2 Timothy 2:13). He does not forsake us, though we may turn away. He loves us with an everlasting love and wants us to love Him with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength (Mark 12:30).

Active fellowship with other Christian men (Hebrews 10:24-25) is vital to our spiritual well-being. We are not meant to walk this Way alone, but in intimate community with our brothers. Only then can we encourage, support, serve, and be accountable to one another. We need this to grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18). N.T. Wright once said, "Christianity is not a religion you could ever do on your own." Why then do so many men insist on going alone?

Restore us to yourself, LORD, that we may return; renew our days as of old. Lamentations 5:21

The Book of Lamentations is emotionally a tough read. The sorrow the people express for the devastation of Jerusalem, particularly the Temple, is gut wrenching. They complained that God had forsaken and forgotten them. But towards the end of the Book, in chapter 5, their prayer takes a turn and ends with hope.

They earnestly pray to God for mercy and grace: "Lord, do not reject us forever, but You turn us to Yourself and renew our days," Notice that they are not asking for God to turn back to them, but they are asking for God to turn their hearts back to Him, which implies an acknowledgment that the cause of the distance was in themselves. God never leaves us unless we first leave him.

There may be times in your walk with the Lord that you just don't feel as close as you once did; your passion for others to know Him and experience the freedom and joy this brings has waned. What is your responsibility in this situation? Pray. Acknowledge that it was you who moved, who did not nurture the relationship as you once did, who let sin come between you. Pray. God turn my heart back to you, create a clean Spirit in me and cause your face to shine upon me. Turn me from my idols and restore in me a pure heart.

God knows we are weak and tend to backslide from Him. We cannot, without His mercy turn back toward God ourselves. As Veron Magee puts it: "So necessary is that grace that we may truly say, turn us or we shall not be turned, but shall wander endlessly; and so powerful and effectual is that grace that we may as truly say, turn us, and we shall be turned; for it is a day of power, almighty power, in which God's people are made a willing people."

When we repent, God restores and renews us, bringing back the joy of our salvation, and a vigor to do His will. God loves to redeem; it is the business He is in!!

"RECOMMITTING OUR LIVES TO JESUS CHRIST, OUR LORD AND OUR GOD"

1 John 5:13-21 ESV

"We know that we are from God, and the whole world lies in the power of the evil one. And we know that the Son of God has come and has given us understanding, so that we may know him who is true; and we are in him who is true, in his Son Jesus Christ. He is the true God and eternal life. Little children, keep yourselves from idols."

We must recommit ourselves to our Lord. For too long we have been under the bondage, oppression, theological liberalism, progressive grasp, and confusing leadership of the United Methodist Church. For many of us the UMC was our Idol. We identified first as United Methodist, rather than born again Christians. We have been in limbo, not walking boldly in the truth of the Gospel, standing firm on the teachings of Scripture, and boldly proclaiming the faith once and for all delivered to the saints. If Munholland is to survive and not just survive but thrive, we must recommit ourselves to the triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We must repent of the time we have not stood firm in the word of God, and we must turn to Christ. Jesus has come to give us understanding as John says above, understanding that is not of this fallen world but is of the absolute truth of God. We must keep ourselves from Idols, making Christ #1 in our lives, seeking to be a servant - or better yet a slave - to Christ Jesus, following the call of our Lord and savior in every aspect of our lives.

Maybe you do not know Jesus as your Lord and Savior, and this is all really foreign and complicated. If you don't, I plead with you, we are told in the Scriptures that our salvation has come in Jesus Christ. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his one and only son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16) We can have eternal life with God! You see we have a problem, in the beginning God created all that we see and know, He also made us, humans, and He made us in His image, a special creation, Male and Female. God gave us great freedom, a beautiful and harmonious garden to live in, and gave us dominion over the land and the animals.

Yet, we thought we knew better than God and broke His command that was given to us. In that moment, the image of God in us was broken and we became slaves to sin. Now our natural inclination, our desires are for sin. We are broken, we hurt ourselves with our sin, we hurt others with our sin, and we hurt God with our sin. Yet He loved us so much that He sent Jesus Christ to bear the weight of our sin, to pay the price for our iniquity, to repair that broken image inside of us so that we can have a relationship with our God. This is the goodness of the Gospel, that Christ saves sinners like you and me, redeems them, wraps them in His love, and washes us clean of our sin. We can then enter into this blessed and beautiful life with God, with full assurance, as John wrote.

I pray that, we as Munholland, move forward, that we begin again to take a serious look at our faith life, our walks with Christ, and devote ourselves once again - or for the first time to God, and His way of life.

"Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen." Ephesians 3:20 ESV

the decision is made, to join the GMC, the sooner Munholland will have a place at the table when decisions are being made about the future of the GMC and how it is being administered.

The decision we will make must not be taken lightly. The Affiliation Task Force and your Church Council have worked hard to bring us to this point. The Task Force produced a document that points out the pros and cons of remaining independent. Take another look at that document, it is a valuable resource. There are no strings attached to GMC membership that will preclude Munholland's easy exit if we conclude that our congregation is not in accordance with future decisions that are made by the GMC.

We encourage you to visit the information table after services on Sunday, October 1, and that you attend the October 8 church meeting. Whether you have made up your mind or not, we need to hear from you.

You have, or soon will receive, a letter from me with more details explaining the remainder of the process. If you have any questions, please contact the church office and we will respond.
